Officers employed on Shore for raifing Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas His Majesty was also graciously pleased, by His said Proclamation, to declare, that all Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should so enter themselves as aforesaid, should receive the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man, as His Majesty's Royal Bounty: And whereas His Majesty was also graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of the faid Month of February, 1793, to promise and declare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman, fit to serve on board His Majesty's Ships, should be paid to any Person who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who might conceal him or themselves, so that such Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's Service, on or before the Thirtieth Day of April then next, by any of His Majesty's Sea Officers appointed to raife Men on Shore, or by the Captains or Commanders of any of His Majesty's Ships or Vessels in the Ports or on the Coasts of this Kingdom: And whereas the Time limited by the faid Proclamations for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward, hath been prolonged and extended to the Thirtieth Day of this instant June; and it being judged expe dient for His Majesty's Service that the said Bounties and Reward should be continued to be paid for some Time longer; His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward be prolonged and extended, from the faid Thirtieth Day of this instant June, to the Thirty-first Day of August next inclusive: Whereof all Perons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themselves accordingly.

The Sword of State was delivered to the Sovereign by Lord Amherst, the second Knight in Seniority, and Sir Joseph Banks, kneeling, was knighted therewith. Then His Royal Highness the Duke of York, senior Knight, presented the Ribbon and Badge to the Sovereign, and His Majesty put them over the new Knight's Right Shoulder, who, being thus invested, had the Honor to kis His Majesty's Hand; and the Procession returned to the Privy Chamber in the Order as above mentioned.

The Ceremony was performed in His Majesty's Closet, several Great Officers of the Court being present.
