(SWINE-FEVER.)

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 30th day of July, 1885.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered; as follows:

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.

SCHEDULE.

An Area at Charlton, in the borough of Andover, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the first milestone on the road leading north towards the parish of Tangle, thence towards the west to a cottage belonging to R. Dowling situate on the Penton-road, thence in a south-westerly direction to a green drove leading from Charlton to the Weyhill turnpike-road, thence in an easterly direction to the Old Toll Gate leading from Charlton to Andover, thence in a northerly direction to the boundary of Andover parish leading to Enham, and thence in a westerly direction to the afore-mentioned first milestone on the road leading north from Charlton to the parish of Tangle.

that is to say, the borough boundary from Wheeler-street to the Dudley-road on the north and west, Dudley-road and the Birmingham and Wolverhampton Canal on the south, and King Edward's-road, Edward-street, Newhall-hill, Frederick-street, Vyse-street, Well-street, and Wheeler-street, to the borough boundary on the east,—which was declared by Order of Council to be an Area infected with swine-fever, is hereby declared to be free from swine-fever, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

And We do by these presents will and ordain that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you, Our said Commissioners, or any three or more of you, may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment.

And We further ordain that you, or any three or more of you, have liberty to report your proceedings under this Our Commission from time to time, if you shall judge it expedient so to do.

And Our further will and pleasure is, that you do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us, under your hands and seals, or under the hands and seals of any three or more of you, your opinion upon the several matters herein submitted for your consideration.

And for the purpose of aiding you in such matters, We hereby appoint Our trusty and well-beloved Charles Edward Drummond Black, Esquire, to be Secretary to this Our Commission.

THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Peking, stating that Proclamations have recently been issued by the Chinese authorities of the Ningpo district, in virtue of which the Le-kin duties hitherto levied on silk and tea have been raised as follows:—

(1.) "The war tax on each bale of silk of 80 catties (106½ lbs.) will be raised from two dollars forty cents. (about 8s. 10d.) to the former rate of four dollars (about 14s. 8d.).

(2.) "The tax on each picul of tea (133½ lbs.) produced will be levied at one tael four mace (about 7s. 8d.), instead of one tael (5s. 6d.) as heretofore."

DUDLEY AUGUST FAIR.

Sunken Rock Eastward of Ragged Island.

THE Chinese Government has given notice of the existence of a sunken rock lying about 3½ miles distant from Ragged Island, on the western side of Pescadores Channel:—

This rock (Courbet Rock), on which the French vessel of war "D'Estaing" touched, is a part of a ledge about half a cable in extent, and has a depth of two cables at low water, with about nineteen fathoms around; it lies with the following bearings:—

Ragged Island, S. 76° W.
Sable Island, N. 64° W.
Position, lat. 23° 37' N., long. 119° 45' E.

EKERSUND APPROACH.(1.) *Vibberodden Lighthouse—Intended Sector of Flashing Light.*

THE Norwegian Government has given notice, that in the autumn of 1885, it is intended to exhibit an additional sector of light from Vibberodden Lighthouse, west side of southern approach to Ekersund:—

(3.) *Time Signal at Riga.*

Information has been received from Her Majesty's Consul at Riga, that on 13th June, 1885, a time signal was established on the Sailors' Home at that port:—

The signal is a ball, which is hoisted half-mast as preparatory 15 minutes before signal, close up at 5 minutes before, and dropped at Oh. 59m. 54s. P.M. mean time at the Sailors' Home—equivalent to 23h. 23m. 32s. Greenwich mean time.

Position of time signal as given, latitude $56^{\circ} 56' 52''$ N., longitude $24^{\circ} 5' 30''$ E.

NOTE.—When signal fails in accuracy, a red flag is hoisted at the masthead between 1h. and 2h. P.M.

GULF OF BOTHNIA.

(4.) *Light-Vessel with Fog Signal near Lilla Mayly Shoal.*

No application can be attended to which does not state the date and place of the soldier's birth, enlistment, and death, and the name of his regiment; his regimental number should also be stated if known.

Should these particulars furnished by the applicant not agree with the facts recorded on the War Office documents relating to the deceased soldier, the applicant will be so informed; but should they agree therewith, then within three calendar months the Secretary of State will furnish the applicant with the usual requirements needed for the proof of the alleged relationship.

The application must be authenticated by the signature of the applicant, and his name should be affixed in the presence of the clergyman, or one of the churchwardens of the parish, or a Justice of the Peace; the applicant's address, with the name of the post town, must also be clearly stated. No personal application can receive attention.

Further lists will from time to time be published, and therefore it will facilitate the applicant's inquiries to give the number and date of the notice in which the deceased soldier's name appeared.
