CELEBRATION OF HER MAJESTY'S DIAMOND JUBILEE, 1897 :—

On Sunday, June 20th, 1897, The Queen attained the 60th Anniversary of Her Majesty's Reign, this being at the same time the longest Reign recorded in the History of these Realms.

In the early part of the year it was determined to celebrate these happy events in such a manner that all Classes of Her Majesty's Subjects, in all parts of Her Majesty's Dominions, might take part in it, and also that all Foreign States might have the opportunity of congratulating Her Majesty on the auspicious occasion—which was named with Her Majesty's approval, "The Queen's Diamond Jubilee."

Under the Presidency of His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, at a Meeting held in London, it was determined that the Celebration should take place in the week beginning Monday, June 21st, and The Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs was instructed to enquire from Her Majesty's Representatives at all Foreign Courts and Countries whether they would wish to send Representatives to congratulate The Queen on this occasion.

The Secretary of State for India intimated to the native Princes of India that Her Majesty The Queen-Empress would gladly welcome them if they came to England, but that, sympathizing deeply with the distress caused by the famine in India, she recognized that many of them might consider it their duty to remain, and that she regarded their sense of duty as a primary consideration.

Contingents of the Native Army, and of the Imperial Service Troops maintained by the Native States, were detached and sent to England to act as Her Majesty's Escort in the Procession and at other ceremonies.

The Secretary of State for the Colonies was also instructed to invite the Premiers of the Self-Governing Colonies to be present as Guests of Her Majesty's Government, and to arrange for Contingents of the Troops of all Her Majesty's Colonies to be sent to this country to take part in the Commemoration.

The Queen having been pleased to desire that The Prince of Wales should take the direction of the necessary preparations for carrying out the proceedings, His Royal Highness appointed the following Committees, to whom were entrusted the preparation of proposals for the various Ceremonials in the several Departments, for Her Majesty's sanction :—

The MASTER OF THE HORSE'S COMMITTEE, which included the Military and Police arrangements, consisted of The Duke of Portland, G.C.V.O., Master of the Horse, Colonel Hon. H. HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES' COMMITTEE consisted of His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, K.G., His Royal Highness The Duke of Connaught and Strathearn, K.G., The Duke of Portland, G.C.V.O., Master of the Horse, The Earl of Pembroke, G.C.V.O., Lord Steward, The Earl of Lathom, G.C.B., Lord Chamberlain, Colonel Lord E. Pelham Clinton, K.C.B., Master of the Household, Lieut.-Colonel Right Hon. Sir Fleetwood I. Edwards, K.C.B., Keeper of the Privy Purse, The Hon. Sir S. Ponsonby-Fane, K.C.B., Comptroller in The Lord Chamberlain's Department, Major-General Sir H. P. Ewart, K.C.B., Crown Equerry, The Hon. It was eventually agreed that all the Representatives of Foreign Countries should be entertained by The Queen, with the exception of those Oriental States for whom the Foreign Office would provide ; that the India Office would provide for the Representatives from India, as well as the troops sent from there ; and that the Colonial Office would make provision for the Entertainment of the Colonial Premiers and the Colonial Troops.

It was also understood that Her Majesty's Government would apply to Parliament for a liberal contribution towards the expenses to which the Civil List would be subjected by the entertainment of so large a number of Representatives of Foreign States.

It was eventually decided that the principal event of the Commemoration, which should take place on June 22, which day was proclaimed a Public Holiday, should be a Procession through the streets of London, in which The Queen should take part, for the purpose of seeing Her People and receiving their congratulations ; that in passing

St. Paul's Cathedral a short open-air Thanksgiving Service should take place; that Her Majesty should be welcomed by The Lord Mayor in passing the Mansion House; and that the Procession should afterwards pass over London Bridge, and return through Southwark and Westminster to Buckingham Palace, in order that the inhabitants of that District, who might never have had the opportunity of seeing The Queen, should on this occasion be gratified.

Accommodation was provided at St. Paul's Cathedral for Her Majesty's Ministers, the Corps Diplomatique, the Indian Princes, the Colonial Premiers, the Members of Her Majesty's Household in Waiting, and those of the Foreign Suites who did not take part in the Procession.

By Her Majesty's Command Stands were erected in the Gardens and Forecourt of Buckingham Palace, commanding a View of the Royal Procession, admission to which was given by Tickets from The Lord Steward to the Suites of the Royal and other Representatives, who were not in the Procession or at St. Paul's Cathedral, and to the whole of The Queen's and other Royal Households and the Royal Servants.

Stands were also erected on the Route for the House of Lords, the House of Commons, the Army, Navy, and Civil Services, and many other Representative Bodies, under the direction of Her Majesty's Office of Works.

In order to find accommodation for the large number of Foreign Guests who were expected to avail themselves of Her Majesty's Invitation, and for whom it was impossible to provide in Buckingham Palace, the Buckingham Palace Hotel was engaged in the early part of the year, and it was later on found necessary to hire several private houses, and to engage rooms at other hotels.

In addition to these, Lord Burton, Lord Iveagh, and Captain Holford, C.I.E., placed their Mansions at The Queen's disposal, and Foreign Royal Guests were hospitably entertained there.

Her Majesty's Royal Guests, amongst whom it was decided that there should be no Crowned Heads, were invited to arrive on the 19th June and to remain till after the Garden Party of the 28th June, when they would take leave of Her Majesty.

The Queen was graciously pleased to arrange the precedence of The Royal Guests and Royal Family, and that of Representatives of Foreign States was arranged, with Her Majesty's sanction, by The Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs.

Officers of Her Majesty's Household were attached to each of Her Majesty's Royal or Representative Guests with instructions to meet them at their Port of disembarkation, to accompany them to their residences and to attend to all their wants and requirements during their stay. It was arranged that The Royal Guests should arrive privately, *i.e.*, without Guards of Honour or Escorts.

A spacious Vestibule was specially prepared on the Garden Terrace of Buckingham Palace in which to entertain the Suites of The Royal and other Guests, numbering over 200 Persons, at Luncheon and Dinner.

Royal carriages were provided for The Royal and Representative Guests during their stay, by The Master of the Horse.

A PROCLAMATION,

For a Public Holiday.

Victoria, R.

WE, considering that Tuesday, the twenty-second day of June next, has been, by Our Royal Proclamation, dated the twenty-sixth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, commanded to be observed as a Bank Holiday throughout the United Kingdom, and considering that it is desirable that the said day should be observed as a Public Holiday in the Customs, Inland Revenue Offices, and Bonding Warehouses in England and Ireland respectively, pursuant to "The Holidays Extension Act, 1875," and considering that it is desirable that the said day should be kept as a Public Holiday by the Customs, pursuant to "The Customs Consolidation Act, 1876," within the jurisdiction of the Commissioners of Customs appointed pursuant to "The Customs Consolidation Act, 1876," and also that the said day should be kept as a Public Holiday by the Officers and Servants of the Dock Companies in England and Ireland, as required by "The Holidays Extension Act, 1875," do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Acts, and each and every of them, and of every other power enabling Us in that behalf, appoint and direct Tuesday, the twenty-second day of June next to be, and to be kept as, a Public Holiday as aforesaid, and We do by this Our Royal Proclamation command the said day to be so kept, and all Our loving subjects to order themselves accordingly.

Given at Our Court at *Windsor*, this eighteenth day of *May*, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, and in the sixtieth year of Our Reign.

Her Majesty was received with a Royal Salute.

The last post, Infantry, was blown by the Buglers of the Guards from the base of King John's Tower, and the Cavalry Trumpeters sounded the last post from the top of the Round Tower.

Guards of Honour of the Royal Horse Guards (Blue) and 2nd Battalion of Coldstream Guards were mounted, under the command of Captain G. J. Fitz-Gerald and Captain The Hon. E. Pakenham respectively.

At the conclusion of the Tattoo the two Guards of Honour marched past The Queen.

In the course of the day and evening all Her Majesty's Royal Guests arrived in London, and having been met by the Officers of Her Majesty's Household appointed to be in attendance upon them, were conducted with their Suites to the Residences prepared for their Reception.

The Representatives of Foreign Courts and States, in like manner, arrived at their various Residences; as well as the Officers of the 1st Prussian Dragoons of the Guard ("Queen of Great Britain and Ireland's").

SUNDAY, 20th JUNE.

Her Imperial Majesty The Empress Frederic, attended by Princess Hatzfeldt Trachenberg and Count Seckendorff, arrived at the Castle.

The Queen and The Empress Frederic and the Members of The Royal Family staying at the Castle attended a private Thanksgiving Service at St. George's Chapel at eleven o'clock. The Ladies and Gentlemen in Waiting were also present.

A Hymn, written by The Bishop of Wakefield, and set to music by Sir Arthur Sullivan, was sung during the Service.

The Earl of Pembroke and Montgomery, G.C.V.O., Lord Steward, and The Duchess of Buccleuch, Mistress of the Robes, had the honour of presenting to The Queen a jewelled Brooch as a Jubilee gift from present and former members of Her Majesty's Personal Household.

Mendelssohn's "Hymn of Praise" was sung by the united choirs of St. George's and Eton College Chapel, assisted by members of local societies, with orchestral accompaniment by The Queen's Private Band and local orchestral societies.

Madame Albani and Miss Agnes Nicholls and Mr. Edward Lloyd volunteered to sing in the "Hymn of Praise."

The music was under the direction of Sir Walter Parratt, Master of the Music.

Their Imperial Highnesses The Grand Duke Serge and Grand Duchess Elizabeth Feodrowna of Russia, attended by Countess Olsoufiew and General Stépanoff, left the Castle.

Their Royal Highnesses The Prince and Princess of Wales, with The Princess Victoria of Wales, accompanied by Their Royal Highnesses The Prince Waldemar and The Prince and Princess Charles of Denmark, were present in St. Paul's Cathedral at a Thanksgiving Service for the long Reign of The Queen. Many other Members of The Royal Family, and of The Royal and Representative Guests and the Corps Diplomatique were present at the Service, which was conducted by The Archbishop of Canterbury, The Bishop of London, The Very Rev. R. Gregory, D.D. (The Dean of St. Paul's), and others.

A Thanksgiving Service was also celebrated at the Brompton Oratory, at which His Imperial and Royal Highness The Archduke Francis Ferdinand of Austria and many other of Her Majesty's Royal and Representative Guests were present. The Service was conducted by Cardinal Vaughan, and Monsignor Sambucetti, Archbishop of Corinth, the Special Envoy from His Holiness The Pope, also took part in it.

At Westminster Abbey The Lord Chancellor attended a Special Service in State, accompanied by 150 Peers. The Sermon was preached by The Very Rev. George Bradley, D.D. (The Dean of Westminster).

The Speaker of the House of Commons and many Members of Parliament attended a Special Service at St. Margaret's Church, Westminster, at 11 o'clock, where the Sermon was preached by The Very Rev. Frederic William Farrar (The Dean of Canterbury).

Special Services were also held in almost every Church and Place of Worship of every denomination in the United Kingdom.

The west front of the Cathedral was filled by a large assemblage of Anglican Bishops from all parts of Her Majesty's Dominions, as well as by representative Clergy from the Cathedral Chapters in England, together with representatives of the Church of Scotland, and of all the great religious bodies in the three Kingdoms, who were specially invited by The Dean to be present at the Ceremony.

Besides these there were also present Representative Members of the City and Corporation, as well as of the Universities of Oxford, Cambridge, and Durham, and Her Majesty's Chaplains.

The Archbishop of Finland, attended by General Kireef, was also present at the Jubilee Service.

The Musical Portions of the Service were—under the conductorship of Sir George Martin, Organist of the Cathedral—performed by the Choirs of the Cathedral, which included the Professional Choir, the Special Service Choir, and the Sunday Evening Voluntary Choir, assisted by the Choirs of the Chapel Royal, St. James's, St. George's Chapel, Windsor, as well as by representatives from the Choirs at Hampton Court Palace, the Temple, and some few of the London Churches.

So soon as Her Majesty had arrived, there was sung, to music by Mr. G. C. Martin, Mus.Doc., Organist of St. Paul's, the "Te Deum Laudamus."

Then The Dean, Canons, and Minor Canons said

"O Lord, save The Queen."

Answer.

"And mercifully hear us when we call upon Thee."

Then The Dean said

"Let us pray."

followed by

"The Lord's Prayer."

The Bishop of London then said the prayer following—

"O Lord, Our heavenly Father, we give Thee hearty thanks for the many blessings which Thou hast bestowed upon us during the sixty years of the happy reign of our gracious Queen Victoria. We thank Thee for progress made in knowledge of Thy marvellous works, for increase of comfort given to human life, for kindlier feeling between rich and poor, for wonderful preaching of the Gospel to many nations, and we pray Thee that these and all other Thy gifts may be long continued to us and to our Queen, to the glory of Thy Holy Name, through Jesus Christ our Lord." Amen.

The Archbishop of Canterbury then pronounced

The Queen then proceeded to the Mansion House, where a Welcome was offered by The Lord Mayor and The Lady Mayoress, from whom Her Majesty was graciously pleased to accept a Basket of Orchids offered to Her.

The Queen then continued Her Route over London Bridge, by Southwark, Westminster Bridge, and returned to Buckingham Palace by the Mall, St. James's Park.

The Queen was received with the utmost enthusiasm by the multitudes who thronged the streets along the route of the Procession.

Owing to the admirable police arrangements made by Colonel Sir Edward Bradford, K.C.B., of the Metropolitan Police, and Colonel Henry Smith, C.B., of the City Police, there was not the slightest disturbance or disorder during the day, which passed off almost free from accidents.

The day was observed as a general holiday and day of rejoicing throughout the Country, in India and the Colonies, and at all Foreign Places where British subjects were resident.

At night the Streets of London were brilliantly illuminated, and throughout the Country Bonfires, simultaneously lighted, blazed on every hill.

THE QUEEN'S MESSAGE TO THE EMPIRE.

To every part of the Empire this morning the telegraph flashed a few words which were everywhere received with the utmost enthusiasm. The Message conveyed the thanks of The Queen-Empress to Her People all over the world for their congratulations, and for the celebrations with which the Diamond Jubilee of Her Reign is being universally marked.

At the Grand Entrance of Buckingham Palace was placed a telegraphic instrument, and when Her Majesty left the Palace, she touched a button which gave the signal for the gracious words to be transmitted into all parts of Her Dominions.

Major-General Sir John McNeill, K.C.B., K.C.M.G., *H.C.*, was in attendance at the Great Western Railway Station, and a Guard of Honour of the Coldstream Guards was mounted.

Windsor Uniform was worn by the Gentlemen present during the visit of His Imperial and Royal Highness.

The Queen, accompanied by The Empress Frederic, Prince and Princess Frederic Charles of Hesse, Princess of Schaumburg-Lippe, and Princess Henry of Battenberg, with her children, attended by the Equerries on horseback, drove to the Home Park, and saw 5,000 school children from Windsor and the neighbourhood. The children cheered, and then sang “ God Save The Queen.”

The Mayor of Windsor and Committee were present.

Miss Long had the honour of presenting a Bouquet to Her Majesty.

Major-General Sir John McNeill, K.C.B., K.C.M.G., *H.C.*, presented to The Queen The Mayor of Windsor, Mr. G. Long, and Mr. G. H. Peters, Chairman of the Entertainment Committee, after which Mr. Peters presented the following gentlemen to Her Majesty: Mr. G. H. Peters, J.P., General Michael, C.S.I., Rev. G. D. Nicholas, Rev. Albert Lee, Mr. Leonard Collmann, Mr. Alderman Dyson, Mr. Councillor Gane, Mr. R. G. Knight, Mr. Bernard Westlake (ex-Mayor), Mr. Councillor Webber, Mr. S. G. Tremenhere, and Mr. E. Kenny Herbert.

The Queen then drove to inspect a parade of fire brigades that had come from all parts of England,

Major-General Sir John McNeill, K.C.B., K.C.M.G., *M.C.*, presented The Duke of Marlborough, who then presented Sir E. Massey Shaw, K.C.B., and Mr. Ian Malcolm to The Queen.

The fire brigades were under the direction of Mr. D. G. Dyson, of Windsor.

Her Majesty, after inspecting the firemen, who were drawn up in line, drove between the lines of the steam and manual engines.

The Queen inspected in the Quadrangle the two officers and 27 men of the Irish Constabulary who had taken part in the Jubilee Procession on the 22nd inst.

The officers, Mr. Singleton, Commandant, and Mr. Tyson were presented to Her Majesty by Major-General Sir John McNeill, K.C.B., K.C.M.G., *M.C.*, and The Queen spoke a few words to them.

After dinner Her Majesty witnessed from the Corridor a Torchlight Procession of the Eton boys.

The School entered the Quadrangle, headed by the Band and Drums of the Coldstream Guards and by the Scots Guards Pipers, to the following tunes:—

The following formations were performed by the torch-bearers:—“ V.R.,” “ LX.,” “ The Rose,” “ The Union Jack,” and the following songs were sung:—“ God Save The Queen,” “ Reign of Reigns,” “ Queen and Mother,” “ The Eton Boating Song,” “ Victoria our Queen,” “ Carmen Etonense,” “ Rule Britannia,” “ Post lustra bis Sep,” at the conclusion of which the boys gave three times three cheers for The Queen. They then marched past to the tune of “ Auld Lang Syne,” leaving the Quadrangle to the tune of “ ’95.”

The Winchester Cricket Eleven were present in the Quadrangle by invitation of The Queen.

The Rev. E. Warre, D.D., Headmaster of Eton College, had the honour of being presented to Her Majesty by The Earl of Kintore, G.C.M.G., Lord in Waiting, as well as—

The Queen was pleased to express to the Captain of the School Her Majesty’s thanks for the beautiful sight that had been afforded and for the Eton boys’ loyal reception.

SATURDAY, 26th JUNE.

A Royal Review took place to-day of the ships and vessels of Her Majesty's Fleet assembled at Spithead, consisting of twenty-one Line-of-Battle Ships and fifty-three Cruisers, and numerous smaller craft of all classes.

The Queen was not present, but was represented by His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales.

A special train left Victoria Station, London, Brighton and South Coast Railway, at 10.50 o'clock, to convey His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales and The Royal Family, Her Majesty's Royal Guests, The Royal Special Envoys, and The Special Ambassadors of France, Spain, Turkey, the United States, and Belgium, to Portsmouth, arriving there at 1 o'clock.

On arrival at Portsmouth His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, accompanied by Her Royal Highness The Princess of Wales, and The Royal Family and Her Majesty's Royal Guests, and The Special Ambassadors of France, Spain, Turkey, the United States, and Belgium, went on board the Royal Yacht "Victoria and Albert," on board which also were:—The First Lord of the Admiralty, The Right Hon. G. J. Goschen, The Senior Naval Lord of the Admiralty, Admiral Sir Frederick Richards, G.C.B., The Second Naval Lord of the Admiralty, Vice-Admiral Sir Frederick Bedford, K.C.B., Admiral Sir Frederick Nowell Salmon, K.C.B., R.C., Commander-in-Chief of Her Majesty's Ships and Vessels at Portsmouth, Admiral Sir Algernon Lyons, G.C.B., A.D.C., and Admirals of the Fleet Sir Henry Keppel, G.C.B., The Right Hon. His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales left Portsmouth Harbour in the Royal Yacht "Victoria and Albert" at 2 o'clock p.m., and proceeded between the lines of the Fleet to the eastern end of the columns, and returned to an anchorage abreast of Her Majesty's Ship "Renown."

When the Royal Yacht anchored, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales received on board all Flag Officers and Staff Officers, after which His Royal Highness returned to Portsmouth.

At 9.30 o'clock p.m., His Royal Highness again proceeded to Spithead in the "Alberta," to witness the illumination of the Fleet, which lasted from 9.15 o'clock p.m. until midnight. The Prince made the tour of the Fleet, and then returned into harbour.

WHITEHALL, JULY 16, 1897.

The following Letter from The Queen has been received by The Right Hon. The Secretary of State for the Home Department :—

WINDSOR CASTLE, JULY 15, 1897.

I have frequently expressed My personal feelings to My people, and though on this memorable occasion there have been many official expressions of My deep sense of the unbounded loyalty evinced I cannot rest satisfied without personally giving utterance to these sentiments.

It is difficult for Me on this occasion to say how truly touched and grateful I am for the spontaneous and universal outburst of loyal attachment and real affection which I have experienced on the completion of the Sixtieth year of My Reign.

During My progress through London on the 22nd of June this great enthusiasm was shown in the most striking manner, and can never be effaced from My heart.

It is indeed deeply gratifying, after so many years of labour and anxiety for the good of My beloved country, to find that My exertions have been appreciated throughout My vast Empire.

In weal and woe I have ever had the true sympathy of all My people, which has been warmly reciprocated by Myself.

It has given Me unbounded pleasure to see so many of My Subjects from all parts of the World assembled here, and to find them joining in the acclamations of loyal devotion to Myself, and I would wish to thank them all from the depth of My grateful heart.

I shall ever pray God to bless them and to enable Me still to discharge My duties for their welfare as long as life lasts.

On the arrival of Her Majesty at the Dais, The Queen was received by The Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Officials of the Borough, the Bands played the National Anthem, and the Choir, of over 100 voices, conducted by Mr. Scadding, Organist of St. Thomas's Parish Church, sang the following Hymn :—
