The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Chester) Order, 1912.

Dated 29th January, 1912.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the Administrative County of Chester, I hereby make the following Order:-

Title.
