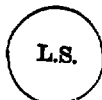
We desire to renew our expression of devotion to Your Majesty's Person, Throne, and Government.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 12TH FEBRUARY, 1926.)

NORFOLK (REGULATION OF MOVE-
MENT OF ANIMALS) ORDER OF
1926.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Meaning of Terms.

1.—(1) In this Order:—

“ The Act of 1894 ” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

“ The Minister ” and “ The Ministry ” mean the Minister and the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries respectively.

“ The Regulated Area ” means the Area declared in the First Schedule to this Order. Any farm, holding, park or enclosure (excluding any detached part) partly within the Regulated Area and partly in a free area shall be deemed to be wholly within the Regulated Area.

“ Animals ” means cattle, sheep, goats, pigs or deer.

“ Slaughterhouse ” means premises used habitually and solely for the purpose of slaughtering animals, but does not include (1) a slaughterhouse which forms part of a farm or (2) any premises on which animals other than those intended for immediate slaughter are kept.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1894.

RESTRICTIONS ON MOVEMENT AND MARKETS
OF ANIMALS APPLICABLE TO THE REGULATED
AREA.*Movement out of the Regulated Area.*

2. No animal shall be moved out of the Regulated Area except into the area described in the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Declaration of Infected Areas) Order of 1926 (No. 31), and then only if accompanied by, and subject to the conditions of, the licence required under that Order.

Movement into the Regulated Area.

3. No animal shall be moved into the Regulated Area except direct to a farm or slaughterhouse, and then only if accompanied by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the place of destination under this Order, and subject to the detention of the animal on the farm premises, for 21 days, or the slaughter of the animal in the slaughterhouse, in accordance with the conditions of the licence.

Movement within the Regulated Area.

4. No animal shall be moved by road, railway, or water within the Regulated Area

except with a licence which may be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority under this Order if in his opinion the movement is necessary, and subject to the conditions applicable to the licence. Provided that no movement shall take place from any licensed market or sale for fat animals except (a) direct to a slaughterhouse or (b) in the case of animals moved to the market or sale which are not sold, back to the premises from which they were taken to the said market or sale for detention thereon for a period of six days.

Markets and Sales in the Regulated Area.

5.—(1) No market, fair, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held on any premises in the Regulated Area except in accordance with this Article.

(2) (a) A market or sale of animals intended for immediate slaughter may be held in any market, fairground or saleyard if a licence to hold such market or sale is obtained from the Local Authority. Any movement of an animal from such market or sale shall be subject to the provisions of Article 4 of this Order.

(b) A sale of animals may be held on farm premises if a licence to hold such sale is obtained from the Local Authority. The movement of animals from such sale shall be subject to the provisions of Article 4 of the Order.

(3) A Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority shall attend and examine the animals exposed at every market or sale licensed under this Article.

Forms and conditions of Movement Licences.

6. (1) Licences for the movement of animals granted under this Order shall be in the form, and subject to the conditions set forth in the Second Schedule to this Order and may be granted only by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate.

(2) No licence shall be available for the movement of animals unless and until it is countersigned by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the premises from which the animals are to be moved are situate.

Movement of Animals through the Regulated Area by Railway without untrucking permitted.

7. This Order shall not prevent the movement of animals direct by railway through the Regulated Area from a place outside the Regulated Area to another place outside the Regulated Area.

Movement of Imported Animals into the Area.

8. Imported animals moved from an Approved Landing Place to a destination within the Regulated Area shall be accompanied throughout the movement by:—

(1) A licence issued under and in accordance with the provisions of this Order by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the place of destination, and in the case of cattle, sheep or goats, by (2) the licence granted by the Inspector of the Ministry authorising the removal of the animals from the Landing Place. (The last mentioned licence will not

be issued until the Local Authority's licence is produced to the Inspector of the Ministry at the Landing Place.)

Saving for Orders and Regulations.

9. No licence under this Order shall authorise the movement of animals in contravention of any Regulations made by a Local Authority other than the Local Authority by whose Inspector the licence was issued.

Production of Licences—Names and Addresses.

10. The person in charge of any animal being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, shall on demand made under this Order by an Inspector of the Ministry or of a Local Authority or by a Police Constable, produce the licence, and allow a copy of or extract from it to be taken, and shall also if required give his name and address.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

11. This Order shall, except where otherwise expressly provided, be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

12.—(1) If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order or of a licence granted thereunder, the owner of the animal and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from or to which the animal is moved shall each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2) If a person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name or address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out,

efface, or obliterate, any mark painted, stamped or clipped on any animal as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4) If any other thing is done or omitted to be done in contravention of this Order or of the conditions of any licence granted thereunder, or with intent to evade or defeat the operation of this Order or the conditions of any licence granted thereunder, the owner and the person for the time being in charge of the animal, and the occupier of the premises in respect of which the same is done or omitted to be done shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

animals. The animals while being moved by railway shall not be untrucked until they reach the railway station nearest to the place of destination*.

Commencing at the point of intersection of the boundaries of Cheshire, Derbyshire and Yorkshire, near Saltersbrook Bridge, then in a westerly direction along the county boundary of Cheshire and Derby to Crowden Station, thence along the road via Torside, and the Devils Elbow to the point where it reaches the boundary of the borough of Glossop, thence along the eastern boundary of the said boundary, to the point where it meets the main road to Hayfield, thence in a southerly direction along that road via the Grouse Inn to Hayfield, thence continuing in a generally south-easterly direction via Chinley Head and Bole Hill to Chapel-en-le-Frith, thence in an easterly direction along the road via Laneside to the Inn at Sparrowpit, thence along the road via Perryfoot, Oxlow House and the Winnats to Castleton, thence in an easterly and south-easterly direction along the main road via Hope to Hathersage, thence by the road under the Railway from Hathersage to Grindleford, west of Hathersage Station, to Grindleford Bridge, thence in a north-easterly direction along the road from Grindleford Bridge to Sheffield, to the point where it meets the western boundary of the parish of Totley, near Fox House Inn, thence in a northerly direction along the western boundaries of the parishes of Totley and
