WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 17th and 18th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 84, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 27th day of February, 1941, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 17th and 18th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 84, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for apportioning the income of the benefice of Blunham, in the County of Bedford and in the Diocese of Saint Albans, between that benefice and two other benefices, namely the benefices of Clophill and Harrold, both in the said County and Diocese:

“ Whereas the patronage of all the said three benefices is vested in the Master and Scholars of Balliol College in the University of Oxford, hereinafter called ‘ the College ’:

“ And whereas we are of opinion that additional provision should be made for the cure of souls within the parishes of the said benefices of Clophill and Harrold by means of that apportionment of the income of the said benefice of Blunham which is hereinafter recommended and

proposed, and that the said benefice of Blunham will thereafter still be sufficiently endowed:

“ And whereas the said benefice of Blunham is now vacant:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Michael, Bishop of Saint Albans, as Bishop of the Diocese within which all the said benefices are situate (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme), and with the consent of the College (in testimony whereof they have hereunto affixed their common or corporate seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order a sum of £9,150 Conversion £3 10s. per cent. Stock, being part of a larger sum of the same Stock held by us for the said benefice of Blunham, shall cease to form part of the endowments of that benefice and shall be held by us as to a sum of £4,000 of the said Stock in trust for and as part of the endowments of the said benefice of Clophill and as to a sum of £5,150 of the same Stock in trust for and as part of the endowments of the said benefice of Harrold.”

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Saint Albans.

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 16th and 17th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 50, and of the Act of the 23rd and 24th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 124, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting an exchange of the patronage of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Pucklechurch, situate in the County of Gloucester and in the Diocese of Bristol, for the patronage of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of South Petherton and of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Lopen, both situate in the County of Somerset and in the Diocese of Bath and Wells:

“ Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Pucklechurch is vested in the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Saint Andrew in Wells (hereinafter called ‘ the said Dean and Chapter of Wells ’):

“ And whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to each of the said Benefices of South Petherton and Lopen is vested in the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of the Holy and Undivided Trinity in Bristol (hereinafter called ‘ The said Dean and Chapter of Bristol ’):

“ And whereas the said Dean and Chapter of Wells and the said Dean and Chapter of Bristol

have respectively signified to us their desire that the patronage of the said three Benefices of Pucklechurch, South Petherton and Lopen may be re-arranged by way of exchange in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

“ And whereas we have made due inquiry and calculation as to the circumstances and relative value of the said three Benefices and of the patronage thereof respectively and we do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council that the circumstances and present values of the said Benefices are as set forth in the Schedule hereunto annexed:

“ Now, therefore, with the consents of the said Dean and Chapter of Wells and the said Dean and Chapter of Bristol (in testimony whereof they have respectively caused their Common or Capitular Seals to be affixed to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Pucklechurch and the Church thereof shall be assigned and transferred from the said Dean and Chapter of Wells and shall become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time and at all times be exercised by the said Dean and Chapter of Bristol and that in exchange for the same the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to each of the said Benefices of South Petherton and Lopen and each of the Churches thereof shall in like manner and upon and from the same date be assigned and transferred from the said Dean and Chapter of Bristol and shall become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time and at all times be exercised by the said Dean and Chapter of Wells for ever.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 13th day of March, 1941, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Campbell, Bishop of Wakefield (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme) for effecting the union of the Benefice of Knottingley, and the Benefice of East Knottingley, both situate in the Diocese of Wakefield:

" SCHEME.

" 1. *Union of Parishes.*—The Benefice of Knottingley and the Benefice of East Knottingley shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Knottingley' and the Parishes of the said Benefices shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes.

" 2. *Parish Church.*—The Church of the Parish of Knottingley shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish.

" 3. *Taking effect of union.*—Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Walter Musgrave, if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of East Knottingley, shall with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 4. *Registers.*—Upon the union taking effect the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of East Knottingley shall be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar-General to be closed officially.

" 5. *Parsonage House.*—Upon the union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the Benefice of Knottingley shall be the house of residence of the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 6. *Curate and Curate Fund.*—Upon the union taking effect:—

(a) an Assistant Curate shall be employed to assist the Incumbent of the United Benefice;

(b) a part of the endowments of the United Benefice, that is to say an annual payment of £250 (being part of a larger annual payment of £393 5s. od. now made by us, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Benefice of East Knottingley) shall be appropriated and held by us as a fund towards payment of the stipend of the said Curate.

" 7. *Patronage.*—After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the United Benefice shall be exercised by the Patrons of the two Benefices alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Knottingley having the first presentation to be made after the union."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 to 1930 relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 12 noon) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms, which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.
