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
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## **Combining half marks**

## **Continuous macrons for Coptic**

These are used in combinations to represent continuous macrons over a sequence of Coptic letters.

- FE25 0 COMBINING MACRON RIGHT HALF
- $\overline{O}$ FE26 COMBINING CONJOINING MACRON
  - → 0304  $\overline{\circ}$  combining macron → 035E  $\overline{\circ}$  combining double macron

## **Combining half marks below**

These are used in combinations to represent a ligature, tilde, or macron that extend underneath more than two characters.

- **FE27** Ó COMBINING LIGATURE LEFT HALF BELOW
- FE28 COMBINING LIGATURE RIGHT HALF BELOW 9
- $\rightarrow$  035C  $\odot$  combining double breve below FE29 COMBINING TILDE LEFT HALF BELOW  $^{\circ}$
- FE2A COMBINING TILDE RIGHT HALF BELOW

## **Combining half marks**

These are used for supralineation in Church Slavonic texts.

- FE2E COMBINING CYRILLIC TITLO LEFT HALF
- FE2F ੱ COMBINING CYRILLIC TITLO RIGHT HALF  $\rightarrow$  0483 <sup>5</sup> combining cyrillic titlo

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
