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General Information

Definition

"The FEZs differ from other zones designated for foreign investment in their focus on creating a comprehensive living and working environment with biotechnology, aviation, logistics, manufacturing, service, and other industrial clusters as well as international schools, recreational facilities, and international hospitals. In 2009, the National Assembly passed the Special Act on Free Economic Zones to increase tax benefits for investment, increase the FEZ infrastructure budget, and streamline the approval process for land development.

On December 28, 2010, the government announced a plan to abolish inefficient, underperforming, and unfeasible portions of the nation's free economic zones as part of its efforts to reorganize the specially created districts. Under the plan, the Ministry of Knowledge Economy removed the FEZ status from 90.51 square kilometers (22,366 acres), or 15.9 percent of the total land in the zones, in February 2012".
