THE AUCKLAND WRITERS FESTIVAL, WITH THE GENEROUS SUPPORT OF FREEMASONS FOUNDATION, IS DELIGHTED TO DELIVER ITS 2021 SCHOOLS PROGRAMME HŌTAKA KURA, DESIGNED TO INSPIRE YOUNG WRITERS AND READERS.

This year we are offering four-session programmes for Years 5-6 (11 or 12 or 13 May), Years 7-8 (11 May) and Years 9-13 (12 or 13 May).

We have been made aware that Thursday 13 May is an Accord Teacher-Only Day for secondary schools in the Auckland region. If your school is able to attend on Thursday we would greatly appreciate you booking this day. If you are only able to attend on Wednesday please book swiftly, as this day is likely to sell out.

To assist schools to make the most of their Festival visit, and in partnership with the National Library, a set of **teaching resources** around key titles featuring in the programme have been devised. Check them out on our website at **writersfestival.co.nz/schools/resources**. Day attendance (four x 45 minute sessions) is just \$12 per student; workshop places (one hour) are \$15 per student; and teachers attend free. Books are available for purchase at the Festival Bookshop and writers will be available to sign books in the breaks.

THE INVENTION OF HUGO CABRET

BRIAN SELZNICK - LIVESTREAM IN VENUE

Is fact stranger than fiction? In 2010, award-winning poet Jessica Le Bas wrote a novel (under the name Jesse O) about a 12-year-old locked down during a global pandemic. Ten years on, her fictional story is now everyday life around the world and has been re-published as *Locked Down* with Toby Morris illustrations. Jessica discusses how she originally crafted her fictional world, how it measures up to what actually happened, and how facts and imagination combine to create great stories. SHILO KINO

Shilo Kino's debut *The Pōrangi Boy* 2020 was named children's book of the year by reviewer Paula Green, saying it shimmers with "life and wisdom" and makes the reader both "feel and think". Inspired by actual events in Northland's Ngāwha, it is the story of twelve-year-old Niko trying to stop a prison being built on sacred land. Shilo, a current affairs journalist for *Marae*, hopes the book will inspire young people to fight for what they believe. She discusses her story and its powerful themes.



CONCRETE ROSE




